Family Activities strive to attract, support, strengthen and build better families. We achieve this by teaching, engaging, and encouraging families to be and live the Catholic faith with joy and love for one another. Greetings Brother Knights and Your Families!

June is the month of the Sacred Heart – culminating with the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus on June 27! Register for Supreme's April 29 webinar to learn how your council, parish and families can honor Our Lord through a Sacred

We continue to promote our 2nd phase to the Meet Life Campaign which started in 2011 and was targeted to reach a goal of 2 million dollars along with decreasing abortions in Missouri in half by the year 2016. Since the Supreme Court struck down Roev. Wade and returned the decisionmaking power to the states, Missouri has taken a strong stance thus eliminating abortions statewide. However, surrounding states such as Kansas and Illinois still allow abortions to continue so our work is not yet done. The Meet Life Campaign has found itself in a quandary as councils who have made donations to Meet Life in the past have now donated funds instead to the Aid and Support After Pregnancy program.


The Missouri Knights of Columbus have decided to award credit towards the Meet Life Campaign for those who choose instead to donate to ASAP. For example, if a council donates \$500 to ASAP, they will receive a \$500 credit towards the Meet Life Campaign. Currently, the Meet Life Campaign in Missouri has received over \$212,000 this year in cash donations for ASAP, Ultrasounds, and the Meet Life General Fund. Thanks to all who have donated.

Please remember that at the 2021 State Convention a resolution was passed to ask every council and auxiliary to voluntarily donate \$5.00 per member to Meet Life Phase Tournament, Casino night, fundraising dinner or just a second collection with your priest's permission. If you need do your best to help save the lives of the unborn!
