Another reminder that June is the month of the Sacred Heart – culminating with the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus on June 27! Councils can spread devotion to Our Lord by hosting a Sacred Heart Holy Hour (with or without the Pilgrim Icon) or distributing Home Enthronement resources at their par-



ish. Resources can be found at kofc.org/sacredheart, on Supplies Online, or for non-members at shopcatholicinfo.com. Important: Logbooks should be returned to State Pilgrim Icon Chairman David Mitchel starting in June. Replacement logbooks have been shipped to Pilgrim Icon Chairmen and they should be distributed to every Sacred Heart icon before the start of the next fraternal year.

Applications for the ASAP program are due on June 30th for the current fraternal year. Councils should submit their forms as soon as possible to beat the end-of-the-year rush. As a reminder, Supreme will match 25% of all donations (for up to \$50k donated) made at your state's convention. Donations can be collected prior to the state convention, so encourage councils to raise funds prior to the convention to donate to this worthy cause! State Convention ASAP applications for Supreme matching must be submitted by May 31st.

We are closing in on our goal of 2,000 ultrasound machines donated!\_ Be sure to have your councils submit their applications as soon as possible for any ultrasound initiatives that have finished raising funds. Councils can also contact past recipients and ask if they need newer models (machines typically need an upgrade after 5-7 years). Additionally, Supreme is looking for a few pregnancy centers who are willing to receive and review low-cost (\$3k-\$5k) handheld ultrasound models like the Philips Lumify. The Missouri Senate used a rare procedural move called a PQ (Previous Question) to shut down a proabortion filibuster and advance HCS HJR 73 to the Secretary of State's office to be placed on the 2026 ballot. Unless Governor Kehoe calls a special session for an earlier vote, the voters of Missouri will have the ultimate voice in November of 2026 to determine if abortion on demand, all 9 months of pregnancy for any reason, stays in the Missouri Constitution. When Judge Zhang removed all safety regulations from Missouri Statutes in a lawsuit against the State of Missouri, women and babies became more in harm's way than ever before. These now-overturned safety regulations were put in place because Planned Parenthood in Missouri has a recorded history of the following, but not limited to these items: dirty abortion facilities, dried bloody equipment, rusty equipment, expired drugs and unqualified personnel. Without oversight, how long would it be before Planned Parenthood reverts back to these abhorrent safety hazards? And because of Amendment 3, our Missouri Constitution would prevent a

woman from suing anyone associated with their abortion for any reason. We knew this would happen but could not get voters educated in time. Please continue to pray to make abortion unthinkable.
