Now is also the time to start planning for the **Advent season**. Being prepared will help your council and





Welcome to October! Once again, we are celebrating the month of the Rosary. In addition the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is designated as Respect Life Sunday. Therefore, I encourage each of your councils to organized daily or weekly Rosaries for the sanctity of life.



It is not too early to pray for a Yes vote on the next Amendment 3 in November 2026. You will be glad you did.It's not too early to mark your calendars for the Midwest March for Life on April 30, 2026 in Jefferson City. MidWest March For Life began in 2010 and hosts through the St Andrew ProLife Committee, the annual march and rally for all pro-life Missourians and surrounding states at our state capital in Jefferson City. The March commemorates the tragic January 22, 1973, U.S. Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion in our nation. It witnesses to the right to life of all unborn children in our state and our nation. It is an opportunity to call upon our state government officials and courts to respect the right to life of all God's People from the moment of conception, to pray for an end to abortion in our state and nation, and to encourage one another to remain strong in our pro-life work during the coming year. There are currently eight silver roses making their way across the United States. Our Rose arrived in Missouri from Illinois on Sept. 21 and leaves for Arkansas Oct. 18. For those of you unfamiliar with the Silver Rose Program, it's an opportunity to share the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe and promote respect for life. The Silver Rose Program demonstrates the unity between Knights of Columbus in Canada, the United States and Mexico, through a series of prayer services promoting the dignity of all human life and honoring Our Lady. Every stop the silver rose makes throughout the pilgrimage is a rosary-centered occasion for Knights, parishioners and community members to pray for respect for life, the spiritual renewal of each nation, and for the advancement of the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe. October is the month for the Rosary. Last year as a State we said over 20,000 Rosaries. How many can we say this October? Let's see if we can hit 30,000. Starting on the first of Oct. we will have a tracking document on the State website under the Faith program forms section. Let's pray together for stronger families and Faith.

The RSVP program for supporting Seminarians has been a popular program for councils to use to support Seminarians and get \$100 reimbursement from Supreme for every \$500 donated. By filling our Form 2863 and attaching the front and back of the canceled checks your council is eligible for the reimbursement. I have gotten quite a few emails from councils about not receiving their reimbursement from last fraternal year. With the help of FS trainer Louis

Raineri, we have been informed by Supreme that the councils that have been approved for the reimbursement that they are running behind with the large number of forms that have come in this year and the councils should expect checks by the end of Oct. If your council is looking to support a Seminarian and needs help, please reach out to the Diocesan Chairman for your council's Diocese and they will be able to help you out. With that being said, the State Council has the MRVF that goes to support the formation of Seminarians and those choosing Consecrated Life. All the money that is raised is split equally amongst the 4 Diocese to be used for the purpose of the formation and educating of those called to Seminary and Consecrated Life. Chairman Tom Broadbent can help you out with any questions.

Be on the lookout for the fall RIB appeal letters that will be coming out soon. Please help support our Diocese with the financial support of your councils. Our Dioceses need the help to provide evangelization programs for all the faithful and to share our Faith.
