These engaging and relevant programs have been particularly successful in attracting younger men and families looking to grow in their faith.



Family activities are slowing down a little bit here at the end of the Things are winding down for the year for the family activities. Athletics programs are completed for 2025. Athletics and activities contributed over \$34,000 to charity so far this year. The cornhole tournament in Ozark raised \$8000.00. The State Bowling raised \$4712.00. The State Golf tournament raised \$5500.00. The Bar-B-Que contest in Perryville raised \$4315.00. State Horseshoes in Oran brought in \$9060.00 and the Sporting Clays at Black Hawk Valley raised \$2450.00.

Moving on from organizational activities to family events, we had a great year with games cheering on the Mavericks and Blues on the ice and the Cardinals and Royals on the diamond. A theatre event will be held in March of 2026.

Greetings Brother Knights and Your Families!

Another beautiful season is upon us already! Time to get those summer projects done and get ready for winter.

Around this time in 2022, the ASAP or Aid and Support After Pregnancy program was just getting started. I know a lot of councils are



taking on the task of raising money and/or donation items for their local Pregnancy Care center. That is wonderful! Please continue to keep the interest in the ASAP program going. Please do not ease up now. Through the Knights Aid and Support After Pregnancy program (ASAP), councils throughout the state can and are helping give at least \$500 or more to their area Pregnancy Care centers and then following up by filling out Supreme Form 11377. This form further helps pregnancy care centers by having Supreme make an additional \$100 donation on behalf of their council. If your council hasn't taken part in this program, then I urge you to do so and soon. Please make sure to mention ASAP as you go around your area educating people to vote no on Amendment 3. Many pro-choice people feel we do not do enough to support women after the baby is born. That is not true, but we need to do more to educate the public.

Though it still is a few months away, councils are asked to begin planning for Roses for Life weekend, January 3-4, 2025. Though the deadline for purchasing roses has passed October 1, preparing to distribute them needs to begin now. This is a wonderful way to help address the abortion issue by having your parishioners fill out these roses and send them to your local, state and federal legislators. Show them Missouri Knights Honor Faith, Serve the Community and Defend Life!

I strongly ask that all councils throughout the state who lose a member of their council or ladies' auxiliary please donate to the memorial board. These names can be submitted to the Chairman Michael Deamos either through the form in the directory or may be submitted on line via the State website. This is a beautiful way to re member with honor all our fallen Knights and ladies. Suggested donation amount is \$50. All deceased members will be added to the board and their names will be announced during the memorial mass at the state convention in April. For now, always remember that life is finite and our call to action as Knights cannot wait.

Make sure he knows we will support him in any way needed. This vote next November will have life and death consequences in addition to restoring protection for women and restoring parental rights.
